There's hardly a ham within 100 miles whom Howard hasn't touched in one way or another. Always willing to stop to explain a technical point — and explain it again, if needed — Howard seemed to have infinite knowledge ... and patience.

We always knew what condition 20 meters was in when we heard Howard say, "Well, I had a good sked with son, Eric, in Seattle this morning."

A pioneer in the development of color television, tracking radar and cellular telephones, he was also one of the founders of our present repeater system. And he helped a whole generation of us become better ham operators.

Countless SARA Field Days ... by the flickering light of the generator, Howard would pound brass for half the night — or sometimes all — and rack up dazzling QSO rates.

Never was the term "silent key" more poignant.

April 9, 2007

Meeting called to order at 6:35pm. Quorum present with Fred—W2EMS, Darlene—N2XQG, Al—KA1IEG, Peter—W2BEW, Mark—KA2FBZ, Ed—KC2MIH, Dennis—WA2JWO present. Four visitors in attendance. Minutes from previous meeting approved.

President's Report:

- Announced that Byron, KC2KOH (now K2BD!) has agreed to chair the club's Field Day activities. Looking for volunteers to assist on FD Team.
- Launched discussion of "branding" items for new informal club name—SCARA. Will be securing stationery items, etc.
- Discussion and approval of re-affiliating with ARRL for broader publicity, referrals.
- Announced that election of officers will take place at May 14 meeting. Need nominating committee.
- Led discussion of report/requests from Jim—K2LM regarding club repeater equipment:
 - Approved purchase of new Austin antenna (approx \$1100) in preparation for 147.00 move to new county tower. (\$2,000 cap, incl. feedline)
 - Tabled discussion of purchase of Comet GP9 antenna from KA2QYE for 147.00 temporary use.
 - Approved purchase of four crystals and calibration for new GE MastrII repeaters (\$220)
 - Approved expenditure of \$250 to Brian WA2ZMS for maintenance of 145.39 (Equinox) repeater.

Vice President's Report:

- Have contract with fairgrounds for Hamfest on Sept 8, 2007
- Hamfest is ARRL sanctioned; will be listed in QST
- Two vendors have accepted; PR distributed.
- Swapfest HT winner passed his amateur exam at VE session. 15 people at test.

Treasurer's report:

- Al reported a starting balance of \$9104.61 at the beginning of the month, and after dues collection and expenses, a balance of \$9566.82 at end of month. Report accepted.

Secretary's Report:

- Many members (33) still have not renewed their memberships for 2007. Many reminders have been sent. They will now be dropped from the newsletter mail and email list.

General Club Meeting

The program for the April General Meeting of the Saratoga County Amateur Radio Association was a most interesting talk by Cheryl Murphy, Warren County Red Cross Emergency Services Coordinator. Cheryl is very anxious to form a working relationship with amateurs in our area to provide emergency communications in conjunction with the Red Cross emergency services.

She listed the three critical elements in preparing for an emergency: 1. Get a Kit; 2. Make a Plan; 3. Be Informed. There are two types of kits: the Go Kit; and the Shelter-in-Place Kit.

The Go Kit contains necessary personal items, in case you are displaced — copies of driver's license, birth certificate, and social security card, eyeglasses, list of medications, contact numbers, and a plan for where to meet your family or friends.

The Shelter-in-Place Kit is for survival for at least 5 days, including water, non-perishable foods, flashlights, radio and batteries, corded (not cordless) phone, hatchet, first-aid kit and other hardware items you may need.

Of course, we all know there's another kit — the Ham Radio Go Kit, which contains portable radio equipment, batteries, antennas, meters, etc.

There was a brief discussion of the personal background checks (including credit and lifestyle) that Red Cross now requires of all volunteers. ARRL and Red Cross are working to negotiate a less invasive arrangement for hams to help Red Cross.

Sid, K2LJH, is now following up with Cheryl to determine Red Cross communication needs and to suggest ways in which SCARA members can help.

The 147.00 and 147.24 repeaters are linked by the 448.225 MHz machine during this net, so feel free to check in on any of these repeaters.


We are looking for volunteer Net Control stations for the Sunday evening net. It's easy. Just keep track of the check-ins and forward them to Fred, W2EMS after the net.

The club operates two 2-meter repeaters. The 147.24 repeater is located 15 miles west of Saratoga Springs at Lake Nancy. This repeater has a members-only phone patch. The 147.00 repeater is located 10 miles north of Saratoga Springs on Spruce Mountain, near Corinth, NY. This repeater offers an "emergency" phone patch. These two machines, in combination, offer excellent North to South and East to West communications far beyond Saratoga County. These repeaters are linked together at various times by the clubs third repeater on 448.225 MHz.
PL Tone for all club repeaters is now 91.5 Hz.
