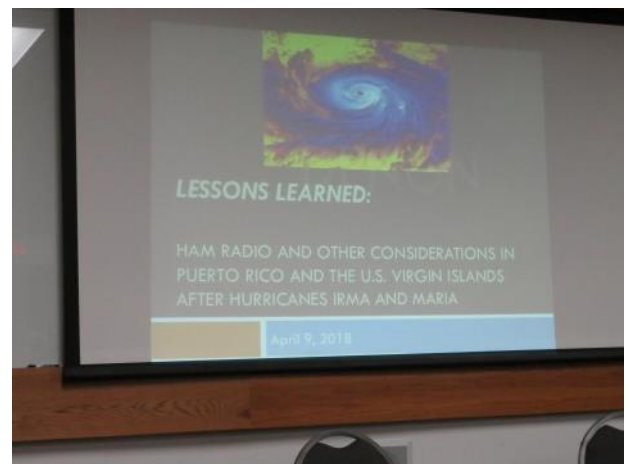

## April General Meeting



Our featured speaker for the April General Meeting was Mike Levy, K2ZIP. Mike worked in Puerto Rico after the devastating hurricane Maria late last year. He was there working as his normal federal government job with FEMA, coordinating worker health and safety.

He had no direct involvement with the amateur radio operation, but he did have a chance to make observations on his own concerning the role of Amateur Radio and how they responded to the hurricane. The electrical and communications systems were virtually wiped out. The hams did manage to restore many 2 meter repeaters back to operational status which did help in the recovery efforts. Mike had a list of lessons learned, and items that we should be aware of ourselves. His biggest observation was that the volunteers needed to be qualified in disaster management. The simple matter that we as amateurs are licensed to communicate simply is not enough.

Mike's presentation was both enjoyable, and a learning experience for us all.

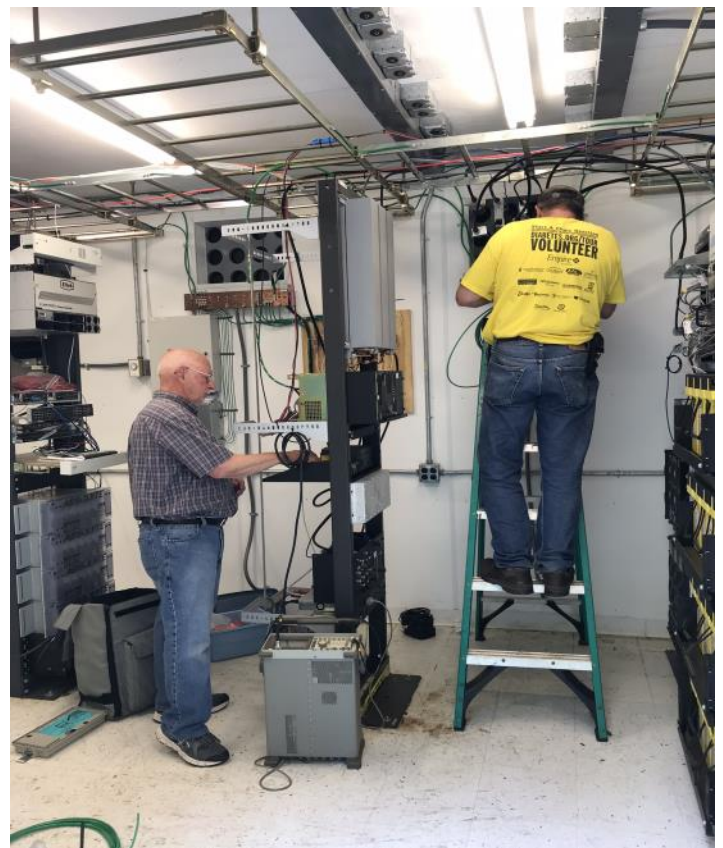
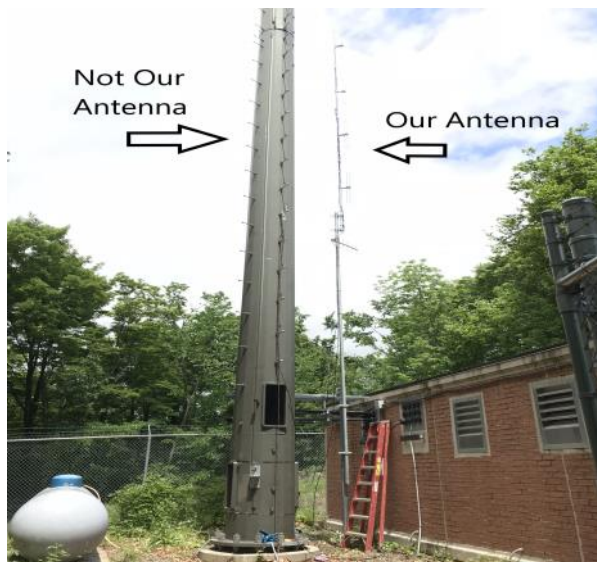
## Fraker Mountain— On the air!!

As you all know, the club has 3, 2 meter repeaters in Saratoga County to support our mission for emergency communications.. They are 147.00 in Corinth, 147.24 in Providence, and 147.36 in Lake Nancy. Because of the terrain of the northern part of the county around Sacandaga Reservoir we have never been able to reliably provide communications in that area.

The club has been given an opportunity to fill that gap in our coverage, and fill it, we have. On June 2 Jim K2LM, Frank KA2QYE, and Steve WA2TTP installed a new repeater at Fraker Mountain, at 147.03, + offset, and a tone of 91.5 just like our 147.00 and 147.24 repeaters. This new repeater is also linked via UHF to the other 2 repeaters. The repeater ID is K2DLL just like our other club repeaters.

Because of the terrain up there, you may not be able to use this repeater from your home in the southern part of the county, but if you are in the Sacandaga area, you will be able to key this up and use it successfully.

The new repeater is expected to get a workout this weekend on June 10 when the Tour de Cure is happening, and the 100 mile route runs through the Sacandaga area.



## June Meeting Agenda

June is our annual business meeting. There are only 3 things on the agenda at this point. The top priority is election of officers for next year. 
