After the dinner John K1AR introduced Bryant Rascoll KG5HVG who gave an outstanding speech on his Ham radio career and adventures. In a room filled with 500 plus "seasoned and aged" contesters. Bryant's speech brought most back to their late teens! Bryant is age 19. At one point during his talk picked up a 3.5 inch floppy disk and asked "what exactly is this?" Tim K3LR shared how Bryant sent a hand drawn QSL card to him for a CW contact that Bryant made using the microphone on his rig as a CW key. Tim arranged to have a set of CW paddles as well as a keyer sent to Bryant in addition to a qsl card.

Hamvention is truly a ham radio operators heaven. Plenty of technology and ham radio technology to overwhelm the most seasoned GEEK. I did not come close to seeing everything I planned on. The reason was because of meeting up with a former coworker's, customers, hams from around the world and lifelong Ham friends.
